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Ryan Everhart negotiated a settlement with the plaintiffs' attorneys. District Court Judge John T. Curtin ended the federal court's jurisdiction over the district as well as any entitlement the plaintiffs' attorneys had to the district's student records and additional attorney's fees.

Hodgson Russ successfully obtained summary judgment in a federal court action in which a parent alleged that the school district violated the Individuals With Disabilities Education Act for a number of years. In this case, the court rejected the parents' multimillion-dollar demand for monetary damages and affirmed the principle that special education claims become moot when the applicable school year ends.
