Former Speaker of the Michigan House of Representatives Tom Leonard is a partner in Plunkett Cooney's Lansing office who serves as the firm's Government Relations, Public Policy and Regulatory Practice Group Leader.

Mr. Leonard served three terms in the Michigan House of Representatives from 2013-2018. Reforming Michigan's teacher pension fund, creating a bi-partisan task force to tackle Michigan's broken mental health system, updating "Kevin's Law," ending driver's responsibility fees, modernizing the state's health insurance code, and re-writing the state's preliminary exam law are just some of his signature achievements during his tenure.

Prior to running for public office, Mr. Leonard served as an assistant attorney general for the state of Michigan and as a prosecutor in Genesee County, where he was assigned to the Special Crimes Division. Mr. Leonard graduated from Michigan State University College of Law in 2007 and earned his undergraduate degree from the University of Michigan in 2004.

## Public Service

- Unanimously selected as Michigan's 75th Speaker of the House and the second-youngest Speaker in the nation
- Led the efforts on major policy initiatives that included reforming Michigan's Public School Employee Retirement System (MPERS), which faced a debt of more than \$30 billion; eliminating Driver Responsibility Fees (DRFs), which prevented more than 300,000 Michigan citizens from lawfully obtaining a driver's license; passing two structurally sound state budgets months ahead of schedule; and creating a bi-partisan task force to reform Michigan's broken mental health system
- Nearly 20 Public Acts signed into law, including a comprehensive re-write of Michigan's health care law and a comprehensive reform of Michigan's criminal preliminary examination system
- Served on the Law Revision Commission, Michigan Competitiveness Committee, Judiciary Committee, Oversight Committee and Chaired the House Insurance Committee
